### 1. INTRODUCTORY REMARKS

In order to provide an objective tool for regular monitoring of the efficiency of Croatia's system for enforcement of intellectually property rights, in the course of year 2008 a methodology for collecting related statistical data was developed. As an integral part of the methodology an extensive statistical report<sup>1</sup> on related data was issued, covering available data up to year 2007.

Following Croatia's commitment to continue monitoring the enforcement of intellectual property rights on regular basis, a further extensive annual statistical report for year 2008 has been issued in the course of year 2009.

In addition to the extensive annual statistical reports, it has been decided (in the course of related negotiations between Croatia and EU in December 2008), that preliminary statistical reports containing rough data will be issued on quarterly basis. This report is the second of such quarterly reports and it covers the second quarter (April to June) of year 2009.

Furthermore, it should be noted that this report is envisaged to contain rough statistical data only, without an extensive analysis which will be available in the annual report. Consequently, the data are presented in related tables only.

The report has been drafted by the State Intellectual Property Office of the Republic of Croatia and is based on data as provided by all stakeholders of the system for the enforcement of the intellectual property rights.

Regarding the specific chapters of the report, the following should be noted:

### Criminal and misdemeanour protection

This report contains the tables showing a comprehensive course of the criminal and misdemeanour procedures from the criminal or misdemeanour report to a decision issued by the competent court. Namely, the data for 1Q/2009 were not available at the time of drafting the previous report, due to the time needed for the collection thereof. Now the mentioned data are given in this report together with the data relating to the second quarter.

### Customs Administration – Statistical data on the number, types and values of the seized products

Since developing of the methodology on which the previous two extensive annual reports were based, there has been a development in methodology related to the Customs Administration procedures, based on the EU best practice. Thus in this report some data are provided in, to some extent, different format than in the previous reports. Consequently, the annual report for 2009 will also provide some data not completely comparable with the previous reports.

More specifically, the methodology and the previous annual reports provided for value of the seized goods based on the declared value of goods as indicated in the documents presented by the parties in customs procedure. However, EU practice provides for the value of the goods expressed as the value of damages which would be caused to the right holder in case the counterfeited goods would have reached the market. Thus, the data provided in this report and future reports for the value of the seized goods refers to the latter values in terms of retail price of the original goods on Croatian market (including the value added tax) converted into euros.

Furthermore, this report contains more detailed data regarding the types of the seized goods, following the EU best practice. Therefore a direct comparison with past data might not be possible in some cases. However, new data format will provide easier comparisons to the related EU data.
